GAME SUPPLIES NEEDED FOR THIS WEEKEND: 1 pair of Dollar Store headphones

MAIN POINT: Everybody's Welcome

MEMORY VERSE: "All of you together are the body of Christ. Each one of you is a part of that body."

1 Corinthians 12:27 (ESV)

BIBLE STORY: The Story of God's Church

FAITH DECLARATION: I have a home in His house.

CONNECT

INSTRUCTIONS:

SAY: "This month we are learning all about God's Church! Can you say God's Church?! Way to go! God's Church isn't just a building where we learn about God, God's Church is God's family! You and I are all part of God's family!"

APPLY

BIG IDEA: This is where we help kids apply what they learned to their personal lives. **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Read Question 1: Who sent the angel to Cornelius? (God)
 - o Apply: Pretend to have wings like the angel Cornelius saw.
- Read Question 2: Is Jesus for Everyone? (Yes)
 - o Apply: Pretend to pray like Peter did.
- o Read Question 3: Who went to Cornelius' house? (Peter)
 - Apply: Pretend to go to Cornelius' house with Peter.
- Read Question 4: Who forgives people for their sins? (Jesus)
 - Apply: Cornelius' family used their listening ears. Put on your listening ears, too.
- Read Question 5: Who did Peter baptize? (Everybody at Cornelius' house.)
 - Apply: The people got baptized in water. Make water waves with your arms.

PRAY

BIG IDEA: This is our opportunity to teach kids that part of having a relationship with Jesus is talking to Him.

INSTRUCTIONS: Talk to the kids about why we pray, ask for prayer requests, and ask them to pray out loud.

SAY IT AGAIN

Practice the memory verse or even try learning the Memory Verse Rap.

ELEMENTARY (K-Grade 3) THE CHURCH

MAIN POINT: The Body of Christ

MEMORY VERSE: "All of you together are the body of Christ. Each one of you is a part of that body."

BIBLE STORY: The Story of the Church is the People **FAITH DECLARATION:** I have a home in His house.

CONNECT

SUPPLIES: Situation Cards cut into squares

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Ask: What is the biggest mess you've ever had to clean up?
- Say: "Hey Church Kids! This month we are learning all about the Church. The Church isn't just a building that we come to every Sunday. The Church is people who follow Jesus—the Bible calls us the body of Christ. Let's go ahead and get into our Situation Cards.
- Read Situation Cards. Have kids answer them.
- Read all the situations until all of them have been read.
- Ask kids: Would you rather be a palm tree, a pine tree, or a maple tree?

APPLY

BIG IDEA: This is where we help kids apply what they learned to their personal lives.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Ask kids the following questions:

- What is the body of Christ? (Every single person who follows Jesus.)
- What is another name for the body of Christ? (God's Church)
- Who is part of God's Church? (Everyone who follows Jesus.)
- In the Bible story, what did people who followed Jesus do to help eachother out and keep the church healthy? (Sold their property, shared what they had, met together, prayed, etc.)
- What do you think it would be like if everyone in God's church did the same job? (Answers will vary.)
- What do you think it would be like if everyone in God's church decided not to do their special job? (Answers will vary.)
- What can you do this week to help out here at church? (Answers will vary.)

PRAY

BIG IDEA: This is our opportunity to teach kids that part of having a relationship with Jesus is talking to

INSTRUCTIONS: Talk to the kids about why we pray, ask for prayer requests, and pray it out. Offer kids a chance to give their lives to Jesus if they haven't already. Take time to celebrate them and their decision.

APPLY

BIG IDEA: This is where we help kids apply what they learned to their personal lives.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Ask kids the following questions:

- What stood out the most from the message? What's one thing you learned? (Answers will vary.)
- What is your favorite thing about coming to church? (Answers will vary.)
- What is your least favorite thing about coming to church? (Answers will vary.)
- Where does God want to make His house? (Within us! In our hearts.)
- If God lives inside our heart, why do we need to go to church? (Because God also asked us not to neglect gathering together. We can do more together. The body of Christ has many parts and everyone who trusts and follows Jesus is a part of it, etc.)
- Would you still go to church if you were told you didn't have to? Why or why not? (Answers will vary.)

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
